By the end of FY06, federal, state, local, tribal, private sector and non-governmental first responders and disaster workers at the entry level must take FEMA's IS-700 NIMS, An Introduction and ICS-100, Introduction to ICS or equivalent, including Emergency Medical Service personnel, firefighters, hospital staff, law enforcement personnel, public health personnel, public works/utility personnel, skilled support personnel, and other emergency management response, support, volunteer personnel at all levels.

Additionally, first line supervisors, single resource leaders, field supervisors and other emergency management/ response personnel that require a higher level of ICS/NIMS training must take all of the above listed courses plus ICS-200, Basic or its equivalent.
